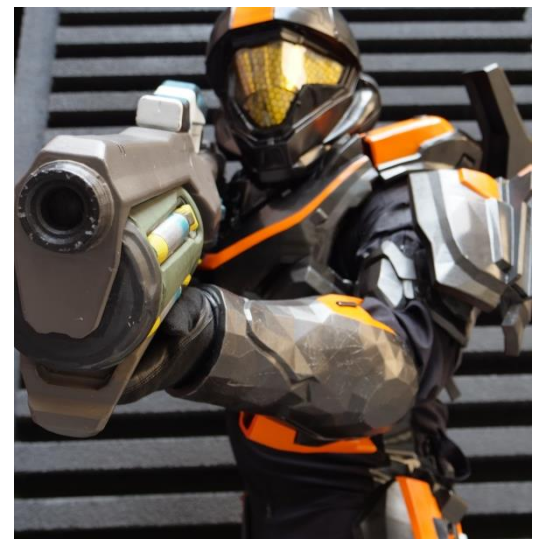
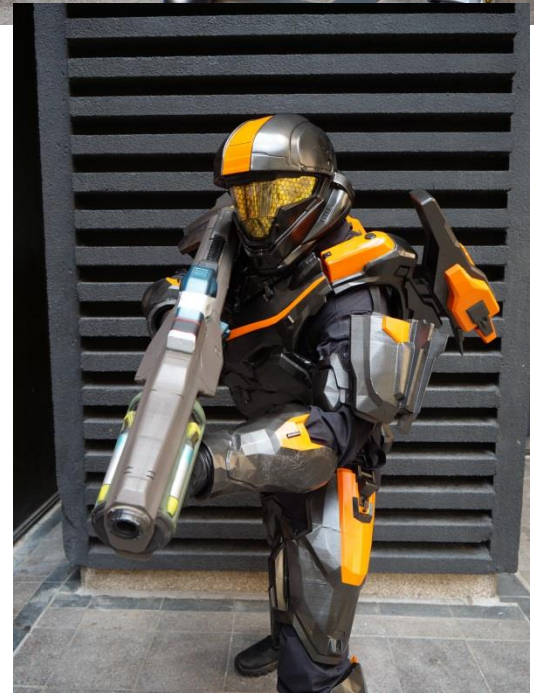

In 2017, we also underwent a massive server update that greatly increased the speed of the site, allowing pages to load much more quickly to you, especially if you are using a mobile device. Along with the speed bump, we increased the security of your data by adding HTTPS to the site, which includes, encryption, data integrity and authentication to your interactions with the site.

Gribbles the Grunt Corner



Total: 55 min
Prep: 20 min
Inactive: 10 min
Cook: 25 min
Yield: 12 cupcakes
Level: Easy

INGREDIENTS

CUPCAKES:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- Fine salt
- 1 stick (4 ounces) unsalted butter, at room temperature
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1/4 cup coffee, at room temperature
- 1/4 cup whole milk, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Frosting:

- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream
- 4 ounces semisweet chocolate, chopped
- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
- Raspberries, for garnish

To make the cupcakes:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Line 1 (12-cup) muffin pan with paper cupcake liners.

In a medium bowl, whisk together the flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, baking powder, and 1/4 teaspoon salt.

In a large bowl, beat the butter and the sugar together until light and fluffy.

Slowly beat in the eggs, 1 at a time. Mix together the milk, coffee, and vanilla in a measuring cup. Add 1/2 the dry ingredients to the butter mixture, beat to combine, then add the milk- coffee mixture and continue to beat, then add the remaining dry mixture. The mixture will look thick and airy.

Using an ice cream scoop, fill each cupcake liner 3/4 way full. Bake until a toothpick, inserted in the middle of the cupcake, comes out clean, about 20 minutes. Remove the cupcakes from the oven to a wire rack and let cool before frosting.

To make the frosting: Bring the heavy whipping cream to a gentle simmer. Add the chopped chocolate to a bowl with the butter and pour the hot cream over. Whisk the mixture until melted and smooth. Let it sit for 5 to 8 minutes until it thickens up.

Frost the cupcakes with the chocolate frosting using an offset spatula. Top each with a raspberry.

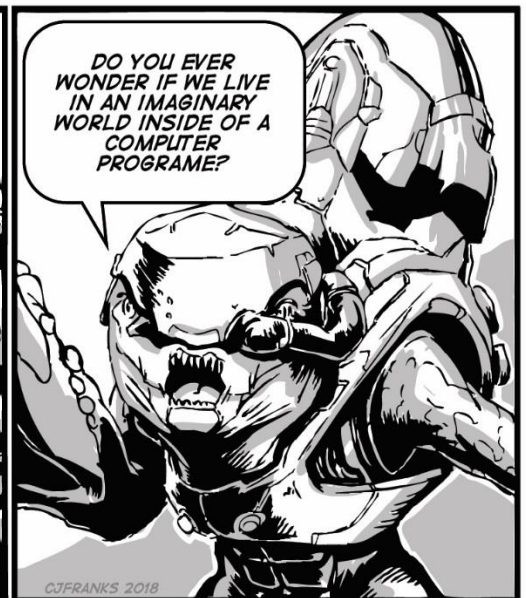
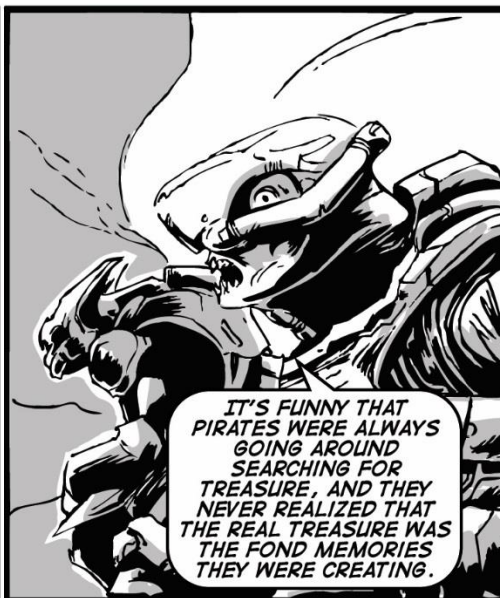

A New Position- Forward Observer (F.O.)

Since becoming elected to be your Regiment Commander, the other two staff members (RXO) Barry Kiker and (RMO) Kevin Robbins have been holding regular monthly staff meetings. During these meetings we discuss a whole range of things from Regiment Merchandise, events, and most importantly Communication. 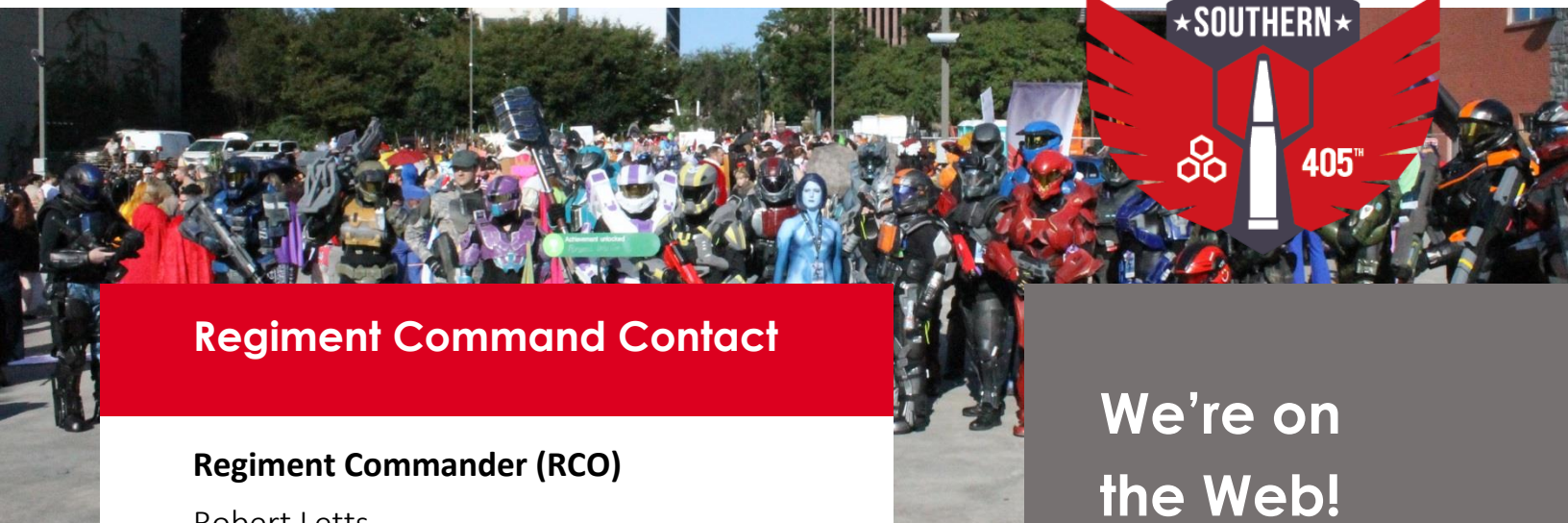
